Human Podcast Guidelines How to create an Episode for the

YCreate Human Podcast?



This document has the aim to provide you with simple guidelines to follow when approaching to podcast creation. These guideline are the result and summary of the process implemented to create the firts episodes of the YCreate Human Podcast during the international training led by Mulab in Arnhem on June 2022.

STEP 0 Define your target and the setting.

- While creating a podcast, different scenarios can be envisaged: you can decide to tell personal stories or stories that you have witnessed, or activate research in your community or other realities such as associations/ organizations according to your topics of interest.
- Set up with your target if they want to participate in the creative process of the podcast as well as give you consent to be interviewed. If they do not have the opportunity to participate fully, be sure to devise appropriate questions to fully cover the story's narrative, to have enough material for further developments. In the respect of the interviewee, it is important to share the script.
- The setting can be one to one, small group or large group according to what can provide a safe sharing environment for everyone.

STEP 1 Share the goal of the podcast with your target: Sharing stories to tackle hate speech and discrimination led by disinformation misinformation or fake news online

STEP 2 Brainstorming stories (Sharing the stories): why is this story relevant to us?

- opt1: single participant: in this case brainstorm in how many ways this story is relevant for YCreate Human Podcast?
- opt2: if you are working with a large group of people then divide them in small teams and let each member of the team share their own story in a strict period of time (suggested 3 min each)
- opt3: if you are working with a small group of people (up to 5 people) let each participant share their own story in a strict period of time (suggested 3 min each)
- resources needed for the activity: timer.
- goal: get started in narrating the stories in a contained time slot.

STEP 3 Human Podcast Creative Canvas and Storyboard: suggested time up to 1h

Whether you decided to work alone or in a group, once you brainstormed the story you want to tell, start working on a draft structure on how you want to narrate it.

- Use the resource "Human Podcast Creative Canvas" as a reference and start implementing elements you would like to characterize your own story.
- TIP: If you are working collaboratively with the protagonist of the story, at this stage give the interviewee a chance to decide whether they prefer to record in their own voice the story they share or have it narrated by a third person
- Use the resource "Human Podcast Storyboard" as a reference and start jotting down the basics of your own story.
- resources needed: Human Podcast Creative Canvas + Human Podcast Storyboard + post it, whiteboard, markers and colors
- goal: jot down the elements of THE story, define the narration and the story.

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STEP 4 Human Podcast Script Making: suggested time up to 1h

Whether you decided to work alone or in a group, once you have defined the story in its stages and details, it's time to transform it in a suitable content for a podcast.

- Use the resource "Human Podcast Script" as a reference to start working on the script of the actual episode of the podcast.
- Give the interviewee a chance to decide whether they prefer to record in their own voice the story they share or have it narrated by a third person
- **resources needed:** Human Podcast Script + post it, whiteboard, markers and colors
- **goal:** state the objectives of the story you want to tell, produce a transcription of the actual spoken lines of the podcast episode.

STEP 5 Rehearsing reading and timing

Once you defined your Script it's essential to rehearse and have a recording trial to validate if the script is functional to your needs.

- Find a quiet room to record.
- Recording short clips can facilitate the editing process in case of mistakes.
- TIP: you don't need expensive equipment to record good quality audio, if you use your smartphone vocal memo, point the mic toward your throat rather than directly to your mouth in order to have cleaner audio.
- **resources needed:** smartphones, voice recording app, quiet rooms, headsets (each participant to be asked beforehand to bring a smartphone headset)
- **goal:** rehearse and deal with technical issues...

STEP 6 Recording and finalising the episode

After rehearsing and reviewing the recordings, make any needed amendments and you are ready to record the final version of your episode.

Here are some tips and useful resources that are free online to help you compose your episode's final version:

- resources needed: smartphones, voice recording app, quiet rooms, headsets (each participant to be asked beforehand to bring a smartphone headset)
- **goal:** produce audio files to be edited and finalised

STEP 8 Final reflection: optional, suggested time 30 min

Especially when working in groups could be appreciated to dedicate circle time to reflect on the activities done. You can reflect on:

- Strengths of the creative process
- Key points for improvement
- What I/we have learned
